Reflection *FROM FR. JAKE*April 26, 2024

Dear Friends of St. Lawrence Newman Center,

During the winter months, my car takes a considerable amount of time to warm up in the early mornings. I suppose sub-zero weather will do that to most vehicles. I have made the mistake all too many times of being in a hurry (nothing good ever happens when we are in a hurry) and putting it in drive before the engine has had adequate time to heat up. The result is a very sluggish movement, and the vehicle quite literally groans. It is not a comfortable experience for either me or the car!

Humorously, perhaps there is something analogous to the life of the soul. It is so easy for our love for God to grow cold and stagnant, often as a result of inactivity or passivity. The cold temperatures of our surrounding environment (worldly preoccupation, fleshly comforts, etc.) only solidify this cooling of charity and when it comes time to "move" in obedience to God, e.g., coming to Sunday Mass, prayer life, practicing a particular virtue, etc., we "groan" inwardly as a result of this shifting into 'drive' mode.

What can keep us "warm" in the life of God? For this is a far better way to live! I am reminded of the great Fulton Sheen's words, "The person in love is never static, there is always growth or decay."

So how do you and I stay in love with God? Let us not forget that our God is a consuming fire and who first revealed Himself to Moses in a burning bush. This is the work of the spiritual life; constantly turning to God so that I decide everything in reference to that love. Jean Jacque Olier (1608-1657) was a Sulpician, a French school of spirituality, and he said that Christianity can be summarized in three movements: 1) that we look at Jesus, 2) that we be united in Jesus, and 3) that we act in Jesus. To look at Jesus?

That is falling in love. To be united with Jesus? That is staying in love. To act in Jesus? That will decide everything.

Let's flesh these out just a bit more. To look at Jesus takes place in the mind, in our thoughts. It is amazing how even a quick second thought can change the trajectory of our day. For what we are attentive to is often a defining measure of our character formation. When our thoughts are rarely on God it is the beginning of the "cooling" factor. That we are united in Jesus is the interior act(s) of faith and repentance, seeking to solidify our belief in Him and to sever all ties with sin and willing disobedience to Him. It is amazing to me how many "small strands of string" quickly become a very strong rope in keeping me attached to things, not of God. Repentance severs all these little attachments. Finally, that we act in Jesus is truly where the rubber hits the road, for nothing warms up our interior life more than when movement in the will is happening. The more decisive we become in acting, truly acting on the Word of God, the more we can run the race set out for us and we will not grow faint.

May our love not grow cold but only warmer in the love of God.
